ZTF public data release 2

On December 11th, 2019 the second ZTF public data release will take place. The release will include MSIP data until June 2019 (included), and partnership and Caltech data until June 2018.

News from working groups

Galactic and M31 Science: "ZTF is still shadowing TESS as part of the MSIP survey, and we will move to TESS-sector 18 on Saturday the 2nd. On Friday the 1st, we are switching back from the ZTF-partnership 'fast rotator' project to the ZTF-partnership 'Galactic plane fast cadence' project which will continue for the rest of the year (continuous cadence observations for ~2 hours at low Galactic latitudes). We are eagerly awaiting ZTF-DR2, which should enable many new discoveries."

Cosmology with SNe Ia: "First, we would like to thank Uli for his work coordinating the Cosmology group so far! Suhail Dhawan will take over as working group convener. In terms of progress towards a first year SNIa sample, we are currently in the process of evaluating forced photometry pipelines, calibration and light curve fits."

Multimessenger: "The LIGO and Virgo interferometers are back online for the second half of O3. The S191105e event is the first binary black-hole merger candidate detected during O3b."
