Change in partnership cadence:

For the next 12 weeks (June 20th-September 19th) 50% of the ZTF-partnership time will be used to observe low Galactic latitude fields (b<15). During dark and gray time low declination fields and during bright time higher declination fields will be observed. Each field will get a total of approx. 200 epochs in R band.

News from working groups

Supernovae and relativistic explosions: "This week, we discussed Yuhan Yao's paper on young SN Ia from ZTF, as well as the development of the (still mysterious) ZTF19aayejww. Many of our group members are also presenting at the upcoming EWASS meeting -- we hope to see many of you in Lyon!"

Galactic Science: "We will start the partnership Galactic plane observations with ZTF this week. We will obtain 200 epochs (in R) for all fields with b<15. We'll observe the fields 10 times per night with a random cadence."

Multimessenger: "IceCube started to release two new public alert streams ICECUBE_GOLD and ICECUBE_BRONZE replacing the old HESE and EHE streams. The first alert arrived on June 19 (https://gcn.gsfc.nasa.gov/notices_amon_g_b/132707_54984442.amon, https://gcn.gsfc.nasa.gov/gcn/gcn3/24854.gcn3) and was followed up by ZTF. Two potentially interesting candidates were identified, which we will continue to monitor."
